

2023 SHERWOOD DODGE SHANKLAND AWARD FOR THE ENCOURAGEMENT OF TEACHERS

DR. PHOKENG MOTSOASELE DAILEY

Assistant Professor and Chair of the Department of Journalism & Communication

Since coming to OWU, **Dr. Phokeng Dailey** has distinguished herself in the areas of teaching, scholarship, and service and has truly made our campus a better place. Her knowledge of the field of health communication is demonstrated by her scholarly work on public health messaging as it pertains to racial identity. She had an integral role in the development of the Communication major and more recently our new Public Health major.

Dr. Dailey has played a crucial role in creating a culture of belonging on our campus and is especially passionate about creating pathways for historically minoritized students to fully engage in every aspect of their undergraduate education. She co-leads a travel learning course in Southern Africa, OWU's Summer Bridge Program, and co-created the now annual Global Majority Block Party. Her students describe her as someone who challenges them to think deeply and engage in critical thinking and as a person who will ask more of them because she knows what they are capable of.

In 2022, she was awarded the Bishop Francis Kearns Award for outstanding scholarship, service, and leadership. She is truly an inspiring educator who reflects the values espoused by Ohio Wesleyan University.

2023 BISHOP HERBERT WELCH MERITORIOUS TEACHING AWARD

DR. SHALA J. HANKISON

Associate Professor of the Department of Biological Sciences

Students describe **Dr. Shala Hankison** as passionate and engaging and appreciate her ability to blend scientific principles with applied concepts and the liberal arts.

Dr. Hankison is passionate about research and involving students in the scientific process. Her research explores the role of animal behavior as an evolutionary force, particularly in fishes. She focuses on how mating behaviors shape population divergence and speciation. Since returning to OWU in 2009 (she is a Class of 1995 alumna), Dr. Hankison has published multiple scientific papers, many of them with student co-authors, and enjoys working with students through independent studies and the Summer Science Research Program. She also supervises students through internships at the Columbus Zoo and Aquarium, Ohio Wildlife Center, and Humane Society of Delaware County.

Dr. Hankison has led travel-learning trips to Tanzania and the Galapagos Islands. She serves in leadership roles for the scientific honor society Sigma Xi and the Animal Behavior Society, and has received funding to support peer mentorship in STEM from the American Association of University Women.

2023 WELCH AWARD FOR SCHOLARLY OR ARTISTIC ACHIEVEMENT

DR. S. CHRISTOPHER WOLVERTON

Professor and Chair of the Department of Biological Sciences

Dr. Chris Wolverton is an internationally recognized scientist who has built his research program around teaching Ohio Wesleyan students how to practice science for themselves. Students comment that he makes lectures engaging and easy to understand, and that he is always willing to take extra time to explain something if they are confused.

Wolverton has been the principal investigator on two research grants from NASA since 2015 to study how plants perceive gravity, one of which was focused on designing and carrying out several months of experiments on the International Space Station. More than 60 different students have collaborated in this work through tutorials, independent studies, and summer research positions.

He has published 16 papers since coming to OWU, many of which include student co-authors. His scholarship has been noted beyond OWU as well. For the past two years, he has served as co-chair of the Biological Sciences Panel of the National Academies of Science, Engineering, and Medicine Decadal Survey on Biological and Physical Sciences Research in Space. He was awarded the NASA Ames Research Center Honor Award and has chaired and served on numerous grant review panels. He is an accomplished classroom teacher, inspiring research mentor, highly productive scholar, and generous colleague.

OHIO WESLEYAN UNIVERSITY 2023 COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

DEYDRE SMYTH TEYHEN '93 PT, DPT, PH.D., FAPTA

In 1993, Deydre Smyth Teyhen was sitting among a sea of Ohio Wesleyan University seniors awaiting her turn to walk across the graduation stage, claim her diploma, and begin her next adventure.

Three decades later, Brigadier General Teyhen returns to her alma mater to give the keynote address at Ohio Wesleyan's 179th commencement ceremony, inspiring the OWU Class of 2023 to forge their own paths and make their own marks in the world.

At Ohio Wesleyan, Teyhen earned her Bachelor of Arts in Sports Science. She has since earned her Master's Degree in Physical Therapy from the U.S. Army-Baylor University, her Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in Biomechanics from the University of Texas, her Doctor of Physical Therapy from Baylor University, and her Master's Degree in Strategic Studies, with honors, from the U.S. Army War College. In 2022, she was named a Catherine Worthingham Fellow of the American Physical Therapy Association, the association's highest member honor.

Teyhen has used her considerable education to build a military career focused on improving the delivery of healthcare, holistic health, and readiness (public health, musculoskeletal medicine, behavioral health, resiliency, imaging, and technology). Her research has resulted in more than 225 peer-reviewed publications, editorials, book chapters, and published abstracts.

"Ohio Wesleyan provided the foundation for me to be able to spread my wings after I graduated," Teyhen said when she spoke at the 2022 Women of Ohio Wesleyan (WOW) leadership conference. "As an undergraduate, we learn those skills of how to ask critical questions, we learn the skills of problem-solving, we learn how to communicate those things, we learn how to connect with others."

Teyhen currently serves as commanding general of Brooke Army Medical Center, located on the Joint Base San Antonio-Fort Sam Houston, Texas. She also is the deputy market director for the San Antonio market and the 20th chief of the U.S. Army Medical Specialist Corps.

During the pandemic, Teyhen served as the Department of Defense Lead of Therapeutics for Operation Warp Speed at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and as the Commander for Walter Reed Army Institute of Research, the Department of Defense's largest biomedical research facility.

In recognition of her work, Teyhen's key military awards include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit (four Oak Leaf Clusters), the Army Medical Department Order of Military Medical Merit, the Surgeon General's "A" Proficiency Designator, and the U.S. Army War College Commandant's Award for Distinction in Research.

NOTES ON ACADEMIC DRESS

The history of academic dress reaches back to the early days of the oldest universities. A statute of 1321 required all "Doctors, Licentiates, and Bachelors" of the University of Coimbra to wear gowns. In England during the second half of the 14th century, the statutes of certain colleges forbade "excess in apparel" and prescribed the wearing of a long gown. It is still a question whether academic dress finds its sources chiefly in ecclesiastical or civilian dress. Gowns may have been considered necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings used by medieval scholars. Hoods may have served to cover the tonsured head until superseded for that purpose by the skull cap. The cap was displaced by a headdress similar to ones now recognized as "academic."

European institutions continue to show great diversity in their specifications of academic dress. However, when American colleges and universities desired to adopt a system of academic apparel a half-century ago, they worked out a system that all might follow. The code for academic costumes now in effect was approved by the Committee on Academic Costumes and Ceremonies appointed by the American Council on Education in 1959. The following information is taken from that code.*

GOWNS. The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves and is worn closed. The gown for the master's degree has an oblong sleeve, open at the wrist, with the sleeve base hanging down in the traditional manner. The rear part of the sleeve's oblong shape is square cut and the front part has an arc cut away. It may be worn open or closed. Bachelor's and master's gowns have no trimming, but the doctor's may be faced on the front with black or colored velvet and with three bars of the same across the sleeves. If color is used, it is the color distinctive of the subject to which the degree pertains, and it matches the edging or binding of the hood. For all academic purposes, including trimmings of doctors' gowns, edging of hoods, and tassels of caps, the colors associated with different subjects are as follows:

Agriculture—Maize Medicine—Green
Arts, Letters, Humanities—White Music—Pink
Commerce, Accountancy, Business—Drab Nursing—Apricot

Dentistry—Lilac Oratory (Speech)—Silver Gray
Economics—Copper Pharmacy—Olive Green
Education—Light Blue Philosophy—Dark Blue
Engineering—Orange Physical Education—Sage Green
Fine Arts—Brown Public Administration—Peacock Blue
Forestry—Russet Public Health—Salmon Pink
Journalism—Crimson Science—Golden Yellow
Law—Purple Social Work—Citron

Law—Purple Social Work—Citron
Library Science—Lemon Theology—Scarlet
Veterinary Science—Gray

HOODS. Hoods are lined with the official color or colors of the college or university conferring the degree. The binding or edging of the hood is a color distinctive of the subject to which the degree pertains.

CAPS. Mortarboards are generally worn as part of the academic costume. The long tassel fastened to the middle point of the cap's top is either black or the color appropriate to the subject. It is customary for degree candidates to wear the tassel on the right side before degrees are conferred and to shift them to the left when the degrees are awarded. This custom is in some respects a substitute for the individual hooding.

THE UNIVERSITY SEAL OF OFFICE AND THE ORIGINAL UNIVERSITY HANDBELL

The Seal of Office worn by Dr. Jones was designed by Mr. Reveley G. Beattie, a former trustee, and a member of the jewelry firm that made it. The seal symbolizes administrative responsibility and is suspended from a chain, the links of which are copied from a chain-mail surplice. A laurel wreath, ancient symbol of a chief executive, surrounds a replica of the official seal of the University and is quartered by keystones, representing the broad divisions of a liberal arts education. Two medallions are set in the chain above the presidential seal, one of which carries a replica of the tower of University Hall, surrounded by the motto: "Christ the Chief Cornerstone." The other seal is a reproduction of the globe with the inscription: "Serving All Mankind Worldwide"

The Commencement ceremonies will conclude with the ringing of the handbell first used in 1842 to call classes to order. It was presented to the University in 1941 by Nicholas Jones, grandson of the original owner, on the 100th anniversary of Founders' Day. It will also be used as a part of the opening Convocation in August.

PHOTOGRAPHY AT COMMENCEMENT

Ohio Wesleyan has several professional photographers and videographers in place at Commencement. Please remain in your seats during the ceremony to allow the professionals access to all areas. Family photos can be taken before and after the ceremony.

A professional photographer from Graduation Foto® will take a color photograph as Dr. Jones presents the diploma to each graduating senior. Each graduate will receive a photo proof approximately one week after Commencement, and may order prints directly with the studio or through GraduationFoto.com. There is no obligation to purchase prints, and graduates pay no charge unless prints are ordered.


