With this presentation of the Distinguished Achievement Citation, the Alumni Association Board of Directors is proud to recognize **Andrew B. Busch** for his passion for global economics and his national reputation in international finance consulting.

Andrew graduated magna cum laude with Phi Beta Kappa honors from OWU in 1983 with a degree in Economics Management. After OWU, he earned his MBA in International Finance from the University of Chicago in 1988.

He was with Bank of Montreal from 1990 to 2009 and served in many different roles, including Global Currency and Public Policy Strategist, Global Foreign Exchange Strategist, Foreign Exchange Sales and Marketing, and Foreign Exchange Trader.

Andrew was the Founder and Chief Executive Officer of andrewbusch.com, a research and consulting firm. In 2007, he published the book *World Event Trading: How to Analyze and Profit From Today's Headlines*. He was a cohost and contributor on CNBC for eight years and has appeared on FOX Business and CNN.

He served as an outside advisor to the George W. Bush administration and the McCain 2008 campaign, and has advised US Treasury Secretaries on both sides of the political aisle.

Currently, he is the Chief Market Intelligence Officer for the Commodity Futures Trading Commission in Washington, DC. In this role, he directs research into the derivatives markets to assist the Commission in understanding market dynamics, liquidity and fragmentation.

For his outstanding work in analysis, interpretation, and advising in international markets and economies, and wide respect in his field, the Alumni Board is pleased to present Andrew with the Distinguished Achievement Citation.
