

CAEP Assessment Cover Form	Satisfaction of employers and employment milestones: ODHE Employer Survey
Administration and Purpose	The Ohio Department of Higher Education (ODHE) distributes the Survey of Ohio Educators to employers of Ohio-prepared teachers to gather information on the quality of preparation provided by the EPPs. The data collection window is open for one calendar year, August to September. This survey is delivered electronically.
Informing Candidates	Candidates are not expressly informed, as the survey is about completers' preparation.
Content of Assessment	The Employer Survey includes 15 items aligned with Ohio's Learning Standards, Ohio licensure requirements, and elements of national accreditation. All items are listed below.
Scoring	Each survey item has a 4-point Likert type scale with 1 representing "strongly disagree" and 4 representing "strongly agree."
Data Validity or Survey Content	The Employer Survey is found to have strong content validity as demonstrated through crosswalks detailing the alignment of the ODHE instruments to the Ohio Standards for the Teaching Profession (InTASC aligned), the Ohio School Operating Standards, and the Ohio Standards for Professional Development. The face validity of the Employer Survey was verified through evaluation by subject matter experts. Their feedback resulted in modifications to the survey.
Data Reliability or Data Quality	
Comments	The Employer Survey was first distributed in 2015-2016. Four employers responded in 2016-2017, and none in 2017-2018. For the 2018-2019 completers, ODHE stopped administering the survey due to such low statewide <i>n</i> . However, they provided individual EPPs access to the valid and reliable survey. The EPP administered the survey and had a higher rate of return, with 7 employers responding. There is no state data after 2017-2018 since the state is no longer administering the survey.
