

Director's Note

Just over 11 weeks ago, an enthusiastic group of dancers and part-time dance faculty gathered in the Jannuzi Dance Studio to kick off fall semester with a dance party and information session. A few days later, we hosted auditions for the concert you're about to witness. And in the weeks since, each choreographer has held rehearsals for their new works. Choreographers and student lighting designers have devised plans to visually support the movement and choreographic visions that come to life on stage. And each week, we met as a full cast for an extended rehearsal to create an ensemble experience for all involved. In total, the program includes new works by six student choreographers and two part-time faculty members, features 16 undergraduate student dancers, and is managed by 10 crew members.

Though "faculty led," this project has been a team effort from the beginning of fall semester. Students did more than attend rehearsals and prepare their moves. Their commitment to the production included serving on committees devoted to community engagement, publicity, social media, swag, and physical conditioning. And students running the backstage aspects of Orchesis have similarly committed to their roles, taking notes and continually improving the elements for which they are responsible. slay. Interim technical director, Justin Miller, built out the stage, mentored student crew members, managed lighting equipment and design, and so much more. And choreographic coaching by part-time dance faculty, Rashana Perks Smith, got the student choreographers from the ideas in their heads to what you ultimately see on the stage.

Finally, you are also part of our team, joining us for the final phase of this project. While the concert is entertaining, I ask you to thoughtfully engage with what you see on stage. The choreographic works are meant to draw you in, to make you think and feel, and to connect you with the physical art form of dance. I know you'll find something to think about.

Program Note: This choreographic work examines the relationship between identity and spirituality and how the two coexist on stage. The choreographic work pulls from movement from the African Diaspora and liturgical dance found in the Black American church.

Artistic Staff

Janet Schroeder (Director) is a percussive dance artist, scholar, and teacher, with particular interests in rhythm tap dance, Appalachian step dance, and body percussion. From 2005–2010, Janet toured the U.S. with music and dance company Rhythm in Shoes. Today she is a performer and choreographer with Movement Afoot and a freelance clogger. Janet has served on faculty in theatre and dance departments at University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Maryland-College Park, University at Buffalo, Ohio Wesleyan University, Syracuse University, and SUNY Brockport. She is also Scholar-in-Residence at Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival. Janet has a Ph.D. in dance studies from The Ohio State University, an M.F.A. in dance from SUNY Brockport, and a B.F.A. in musical theatre from Ohio Northern University.

Isaiah L. Harris (Faculty Choreographer) is an African-American dancer with a background in West African diasporic dance, ballet, modern, and hip-hop. Isaiah holds a BFA in Dance from The College at Brockport, SUNY, and an MFA in Dance at The Ohio State University. His current research investigates social dance as medicine and its ability to combat type-2 diabetes, hypertension, and stroke. Isaiah's goal is to figure out how West African, Caribbean, and Black social dance can be factors to prevent these diseases in the Black community. Lastly, he is interested in the dancing spirit and how it manifests itself in the black body, using West African, Caribbean, Black social dance, and classical modern as vehicles to engage with the spiritual energy to coexist together both in the studio and on the stage.

Rashana Perks Smith (Choreographic Coach) is a dance artist and educator creating and facilitating performances in the greater Columbus, Ohio area. Her research straddles choreography and curation within the realms of neighborhood art projects and higher educational institutions. Collaboratively, Smith creates work with artists from a range of disciplines and facilitates projects that reflect human connections and community with an emphasis on non-traditional performance spaces. As the artistic director of Motor Dance, she has produced and performed original choreography and conducted workshops and master classes nationwide. Smith's work has been funded by the Coca Cola Critical Difference for Women Award, the OSU Alumni Grants for Graduate Research and Scholarship, and by the Greater Columbus Arts Commission. She holds a BFA in dance from University of Texas at Austin and an MFA in Dance at The Ohio State University with a focus on Choreography and Technology. At Ohio Wesleyan University, she teaches performance practices, dance

composition; dance history; dance film studies; and contemporary, jazz, and social dance practices.

Justin A. Miller (Technical Director) is excited to be rejoining the Bishops this year as the Interim Technical Director. Justin received his MFA in Scene Design from The Ohio State University in 2018. He has worked professionally as a designer, scenic artist, carpenter, and technical director in Houston, Columbus, Montana as well as Washington D.C.
