Spanish Courses A minimum of nine courses (≥ 0.7 credits each) above the SPAN 111 level. No more than three courses numbered below SPAN 300 may be counted toward the major. Up to three courses may be transferred from an approved, semester-long study abroad program; up to two courses from an approved summer program abroad. Normally, no more than one independent study or directed readings (SPAN 490 , SPAN 491) may be applied to the major. Only in exceptional cases, and with departmental approval, may a student take fewer than 6 courses in residence (at Ohio Wesleyan).	

Each course is 1 unit or 3.70 semester hours, unless otherwise specified.

Students pursuing their teaching license in the Multi-Age Teacher Education Program in World Languages need to take their *World Language Content Methods* course online through Weber University online (FRLANG 4500). This course should be completed either during the summer after completion of EDUC 370: *Secondary Methods* or the following fall semester.

Registration for summer typically opens in April.

Please Note: The summer online course typically runs from May through August.

Registration for fall typically opens in July

Please Note: The fall online course typically runs from August through December.

Students if you are completing this course during the **fall semester**, you will need to register for at least **3.25 units at OWU to maintain full-time status**. This course is **not** counted towards the 3.25 units of credit.

Dr. Sarah Kaka will notify the Office of the Provost-OWU with the names of the students needing to be enrolled in Weber State course. **Students, you must follow up with the Administrative Assistant in the Office of the Provost-OWU as soon as you are ready to register. Students, please review the registration periods listed above. The Provost's Office will be paying the online course fee associated with FRLANG 4500, so it is important to communicate with them in a timely manner.**

The Education Department considers the Weber State online foreign language methodology course as the equivalent to EDUC 378: *Teaching Foreign Language in Elementary Schools*. The Academic Status Committee at Ohio Wesleyan has agreed to waive the petition for dual enrollment if the student completes this course during the fall semester. No petition is needed for summer enrollment.

This is an online course offered by Weber State University, recommended by the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages, and by the Modern Language Association, the two main professional organizations that lead and regulate the teaching of languages in the US.
